"Primate Social Systems, Reproduction, and Breeding" October 24 – 26, 2007

For the discussion of primate keeping and breeding in captivity the mating systems of different primates are one of the key issues. This discussion has to be conducted in context of the respective social systems of the primate species. We start this course module with these two ethological aspects. Sessions about the morphological and physiological aspects of reproduction, which is important for the understanding of laboratory primate breeding, complement the course schedule. The last day of the course is dedicated to concrete topics of ontogenesis, breeding and genetic population management.

The course will give the possibility to discuss these issues in an auditorium of experienced colleagues.

"Primate Behaviour, Environmental Enrichment, and Ethical Aspects"

October 29 - November 1, 2007

Primate behaviour and environmental enrichment is a main topic for the welfare of captive primates. The general and social behaviour of primates will be highlighted in the first part of this course, followed by sessions on the behavioural needs of the different primate species. These are important for their psychological and physical well-being. Another session is dedicated to environmental enrichment which is essential for the quality of life of kept primates.

Our strong responsibility for the welfare of captive primates requires that ethical guidelines and corresponding legislation is observed. We have included these two topics to meet the current and forthcoming trends, and also to provide a forum for discussion of this issue. Aspects of primate communication are addressed in the final course section.
